About Bormio

Bormio is a charming town in the Rhaetian Alps of Italy, just across the border from St. Moritz .

In the early years Bormio was founded by Ligurian, Celtic and Germanic tribes. Germanic tribes [Lombards] traveled from southern Sweden and worked their way down into Italy by the 6th century. They established permanent German rule in Italy until the Italians named the region of Lombardia after them.

After several occupation conflicts in 1721, Bormio was officially united to the region of Lombardy. The Valtellina and the Valchiavenna valleys had always played a remarkable role regarding the relations and trade between Italy and the other northern states. Due to the fact of their strategic location being a key route between Italy and the North.



In Bormio you can walk the Roman walls with a new friend, sleep where Napoleon did, play at being a centurion in a Roman thermal bath, or roam the hills of a region featured in Hemingway's World War I novels. Much of Bormio's Romanesque architecture and history have been preserved in local museums, churches, and palaces.

In the medieval part of the village are hotels, restaurants, and shops that make strolling a fashionable delight. You do not have to wait for the disco to open to be caught up in the friendly aprés ski scene. Shoppers discover bargains in leather, clothing, and ski boots. Many of the world's best-known boots are made in Italy.

Bormio, widely recognized for its spa and thermal treatments, has been regarded as an internationally renowned ski resort since hosting the 1985 Alpine Ski World Championship. It will be the site again in 2005, a mere three weeks prior to our arrival.

Skiing / Boarding

At Bormio you will find 20 miles of groomed slopes, plenty of off-piste opportunities, the longest run of six miles and a vertical drop of more than 5,800 feet.

In addition to Bormio there are three other areas—the facing mountain above the di Dentro Valley, the charming area of Santa Caterina [20 minutes away] and the large ski circus of Livigno, the duty free village 30 minutes up the road. All are covered by a common ski pass. Stelvio, an extraordinary area atop a rugged mountain pass, offers glacier skiing, but only in summer. Deep snow clogs the road in winter.

The Thermal Healing Baths

Bormio's origins are inextricably linked to its thermal waters, which have been renowned for their curative powers since ancient times. The nine springs are mentioned in Roman documents dating back to the first century AD. Today the tradition continues in modern thermal baths.

One of the true highlights of the area, Bagni Vecchi baths make a soak after [or instead of] a day on the slopes all the more enjoyable. The Bagni Vecchi thermal center rests on a hillside [in Valdidentro], about three kilometers [1.6 miles] from town. A taxi ride will is very reasonable and saves much time.

The Bagni Vecchi is quite impressive. Massages are available, but it's all about the pool selection. Some people follow a prescribed route through the potpourri of pools, while others do the random thing.

Many spa goers begin with a swim or soak in the outdoor mineral pool. The crisp air and warm water will

sooth anyone's bones. Sit under one of the small canals where naturally flowing warm water spills into the pool to fully enjoy the experience. After the outdoor pool experience, venture inside. The indoor three-room pool provides something equivalent to a relaxing hot shower. Gallons of hot water rush from deep thermal springs before they cascade onto the soakers.

Follow the smell of eggs and enter the lukewarm sulphur pool. Many locals and visitors claim that this pool heals many ailments, including arthritis. Price is about €27 [\$30] a visit. Groups of five will run about €20 [\$22] a person. Taxi rides are €5 for a maximum of 4 people. A three-day consecutive day package is €70 [\$85]. It's more than worth the price of admission.

A less impressive spa option would be the modern Stabilimento delle Terme Bormiesi [thermal water plant of Bormio], with its thermal water swimming pool.





Excursions

If it seems necessary to venture beyond the ski slopes, then consider a day trip to Livigno. It's only about 20 kilometers [12 miles] away, so the option exists to catch the bus [during the winter, a bus service from Bormio to Livigno runs four times a day; only two on Sunday], and it costs about €5 [US\$6] for a round-trip. The city's layout and architecture seem more like a typical ski town, with fewer churches and towers and more bars and clubs. During the day, skip the slopes and hit the stores. Livigno falls into a duty-free zone, so many stores offer heavy discounts on perfume, clothes, ski equipment, and other items.

At the extreme northern end of Bormio in Via Monte Ortigara sits the Museo Mineralogico Naturalistico Valli di Bormio [mineralogical museum], which houses interesting mineral and geologic exhibits. It might be a good idea to head here during the spring months, as the nearby Botanical garden

makes a great place to picnic, providing that the weather cooperates.

A major wine region exists in the area. If you're into wines, Gene will be setting up a visit to a local winery.

Attractions

This little town does not display the marquee sights that many European cities offer, but compared to most ski areas, there remains plenty to see off the slopes. In the Piazza Cavour, just east of the center of town, sits the Baroque parish church, the Chiesa Collegiata SS. Gervasio e Protasio. It's a 17th-century beauty. Just to the left stands the loggia of the Kuéerc, the former court of justice. From here, it's only a short stroll to the Museo Civico, which houses a historic collection of artwork. Don't miss the Torre Civica [town tower], which sits in front of the Kuéerc. People often use this scenic area as a meeting spot.



About Malta

Malta is such a small place. It is just an archipelago of islands about halfway between the coasts of Sicily and North Africa. Set in the clear blue Mediterranean Sea, the Maltese islands are the most southerly European country. The archipelago consists of five islands: Malta, Gozo and Comino, together with two other uninhabited islands Cominetto and Filfla. The total area is approximately 316 sq kms [Malta 246 sq km, Gozo 67 sq km, Comino 2.7 sq km].

The strategic position of Malta, Gozo and Comino has made these Mediterranean islands a crossroad of history and a bone of contention. The powers of Europe's past knew it well as a steppingstone between Europe and North Africa. Involved in Malta's history are the Stone-Age and Bronze-Age people, Romans and Phoenicians, Arabs, Normans and Carthaginians, Castilians, French and British; from whom Malta became independent in 1964. Napoleon Bonaparte did unutterable damage in an only six-day occupation; and Malta stood firm against Hitler despite massive bombing during World War II, deservedly earning the nation the George Cross medal from

King George VI [April 1942] and depicting it on the left hand corner of the flag.

Gozo is just four miles away to the northwest across a clear blue and very deep channel. The two Islands are connected by regular car and passenger ferry and a helicopter service. Gozo is where Ulysses is said to

have been held captive entranced by the nymph Calypso. This sister island is almost entirely agricultural, and life is simple but comfortable. It is an island of farmers and fishermen, and their way of life dominates the character of Gozo.












Frequent Flyer Miles

It is your responsibility to get your Frequent Flyer Miles when you check in. Delta is partnered with Air France, Alitalia, Continental, Northwest, KLM and others.

Baggage Restrictions [This is important stuff]

Carry-on bags:

You may carry on one bag and one personal item such as a purse, briefcase, or laptop computer. A carry-on bag must fit under your seat or in the overhead bin. Its linear dimensions [length + width + height] cannot exceed 9" x 14" x 22" [23 cm x 35.5 cm x 56 cm] or weigh more than 40 lbs / 18 kgs. The airline may require that a carry-on item travel as checked baggage if the item cannot safely be stowed on a particular flight.

The following personal items are exempt from the one piece limit:

- o Small purses [no larger than 25 linear inches]
- o Briefcases
- o Laptop computers [All laptop/computers must be carried aboard and cannot be checked]
- o Camera Case
- o Child safety seats for ticketed children
- o Assistive devices [e.g. canes, crutches, etc.]
- o Outer garments [e.g. coats, hats, etc.]

Additional Items that may be brought on board and do not count towards your allowance:

- o Food item for immediate consumption
- o One box or bag of duty free
- o One item of reading material

Checked bags:

For international flights you may travel with two free checked bags.

- o Your largest checked bag must have linear dimensions that does not exceed 62 inches / 157.5 cm and must weigh no more than 70 pounds / 31.5 kg. Note for those going to Malta: The weight limit will be less than 50 lbs.
- o Each checked bag must have only the name of the person traveling on the outside of the bag [inside too].

Excess bags:

The following information for excess baggage applies to Delta international flights. Any of these additional charges are collected on a one-way basis.

- o Checked baggage in excess of the free baggage allowance will be charged \$40 per piece for first item and \$80 each for the second and third items.
- o Checked bags weighing over 70 pounds / 31.5 kg or with a linear dimension [length + height + width] greater than 62 inches / 157.5 cm will be charged \$80 per piece. This is on top of any charge assessed for additional baggage.
- o Bags weighing more than 100 pounds / 45 kg or over 80" will not be accepted as checked baggage.
- o Airlines may limit the amount of excess baggage when such excess prevents them from transporting each traveler's free baggage allowance.

Skis / Boards:

You may substitute one set of ski or board equipment for one piece of the two allowable checked pieces.

- o A ski set consists of one pair of skis/bindings/poles and boots. Boots must be in a separate bag.
- o A snowboard set consists of snowboard/bindings. Snowboard size range 53-64 in/135-165 cm.
- o Your boot bag must be separate and just contain boots, i.e, not a big bag that includes your boots. Do not stuff your ski/board bag with clothes or it may be considered to be your third bag and you will be charged for excess luggage. If in doubt, contact United for clarification.

Malta:

Our flight to Malta is local flight and their retrictions are typically tighter than our US domestic flights.

o Your largest checked bag must weigh less than 50 lbs. / 23 kgs.

Equipment Rental

Ski and snowboard rental is available in Bormio.

Membership Requirements

To attend a Pacific Rim Ski Week you must be a member of the Pacific Rim Alliance. If you are not a current member of Pac Rim, please send a check made out to Pacific Rim for \$8 for individuals or \$10 for families with your final payment.

Smoking

We are almost exclusively a non-smoking group so that whenever Pac Rim has control, such as on the bus and at any of our parties, smoking will not be allowed. As most of you must know, smoking is pretty common place outside California. They do not as a rule have non-smoking sections and when they do they are practically right on top of the smokers. Smoking will NOT be permitted on the flight.

Travel Documents

You are responsible for the correctness and validity of your travel documents. A valid passport is required by the airlines. The name on your airline tickets must match your name on your passport. Your passport should be vaild until at least June 2, 2005.

I am also aware that the risks, dangers and hazards referred to above exist throughout the ski area and that many are unmarked. I FREELY ACCEPT AND FULLY ASSUME ALL SUCH RISKS, DANGERS AND HAZARDS AND THE POSSIBILITY OF PERSONAL INJURY, DEATH, PROPERTY DAMAGE OR LOSS, RESULTING THEREFROM.

RELEASE OF LIABILITY, WAIVER OF CLAIMS AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT
