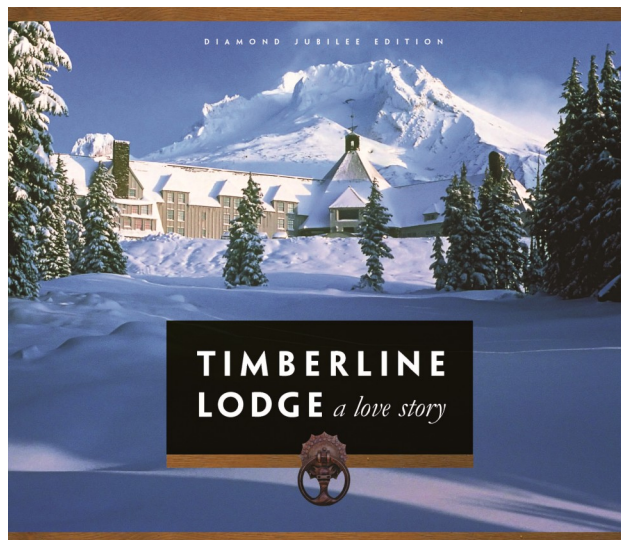
Timberline Lodge: A Love Story, Diamond Jubilee Edition

Portland, Oregon, (October, 2010)— To help celebrate the upcoming 75th anniversary of Timberline Lodge, R.L.K. and Company, longtime operators of the historic lodge and surrounding ski area, is releasing a new book, *Timberline Lodge: A Love Story, Diamond Jubilee Edition*. Situated at the 6000 foot level of Oregon's beautiful Mt. Hood, Timberline Lodge is a genuine icon of the Great Northwest. Built during the throes of the Great Depression, this quintessential ski lodge is one of the nation's best known WPA buildings, having been built and furnished entirely by Northwest craftsmen and artisans working under President Franklin Roosevelt's New Deal Federal Arts Project. There is a strong sense of place here, even a *power* of place, and yet Timberline is more than just a place. There is a special and collective love story behind this place. *Timberline Lodge: A Love Story, Diamond Jubilee Edition* tells that story.

Few who visit today know the rich history behind Timberline Lodge and that it was a symbol of hope and purpose to an entire nation. Few also know that it was nearly derelict by the 1950s, nor do they know the story of Richard L. Kohnstamm, "the man who saved Timberline." And, while people continue to fall in love with Timberline Lodge, few know just how rich and interesting this collective love story is.
